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## Grand Alliance announces changes to Europe-Far East service

**Hong Kong, Feb. 2**  
The member lines of the Grand Alliance, Hapag-Lloyd, MISC Berhad, NYK and OOCL, have decided to suspend their EU5 Service between Europe and Asia with immediate effect. The weekly service has been operated by eight vessels with an average capacity of 3,300 TEU. Ports of call have been Shanghai, Ningbo,

Xiamen, Singapore, Amsterdam, Hamburg, Southampton, Singapore and back to Shanghai with a round voyage time of 56 days. The suspension is preliminarily fixed until June 2009. This service change is in response to the global economic slowdown that has led to reduced customer demand. However, the Grand Alliance is still offering

a variety of services between Europe and the Far East covering all major port pairs with weekly sailings. Customers currently using the EU5 service have several alternative options, as the mentioned ports are amongst others covered by EU3 and EU4. The Grand Alliance, formed in 1998, is the leading integrated consortium in global container shipping.

## Mainline boxships calls at NMPT

**Mangalore, Feb. 2**  
Container traffic at New Mangalore Port is all set to reach new heights with the calling of 3 main line vessels, viz., m.v. Kota Anggun (ETA January 30), m.v. Delmas Twiga (ETA February 2) and m.v. Kota Henning (ETA February 6). These main line vessels are coming directly from East Africa, all carrying raw cashew. Pertinently, the first main line vessel of the season, m.v. Kota Manis,

had called at the Port on January 20 and unloaded 185 boxes of raw cashew and sailed off the same day. Welcoming the direct calls, Mr P. Tamilvanan, Chairman of the New Mangalore Port Trust (NMPT), stated that the calling of more main line vessels would bolster the container traffic here and thereby benefit the importers and exporters from the hinterland in terms of time and economics.

## UASC Launches IMR Service Dubai, February. 2

UASC has announced the launch of the new service IMR (ISC - Middle East - Red Sea Service) covering Pakistan & India to Arabian Gulf and Red Sea destinations. It similarly connects Arabian Gulf to Red Sea Destinations. The new IMR service deploys a total of 6 x 2,000 TEU vessels. Port rotation on the IMR Service is as follows: Karachi - Port Qasim - Pipapav - Nhava Sheva - Ras Al Khaimah - Jebel Ali - Djibouti - Jeddah - Yanbu - Aqaba - Sohkna - Jeddah - Port Sudan - Hodeidah - Ras Al Khaimah - Jebel Ali - Karachi. This service will also relay cargo from/to UASC main line services thereby effectively connecting U.S. East Coast, Asia, North Europe and Mediterranean to all ports serviced by the IMR Service via UASC's hub ports in Jeddah and the Arabian Gulf. The IMR Service already commenced with the first sailing of M/V Hammurabu 001W from Port Qasim.

## Cosco's 1st Vessel Calls At GTI Mumbai, February. 2

The inaugural call of the COSCO vessel, m. v. Empress Sea Voy. 167W, under the China-Nhava Sheva-Persian Gulf (CPG 2) service, took place at Gateway Terminals India (GTI), Nhava Sheva, on January 23. COSCO has deployed 2 vessels on the CPG 2 service. Port rotation is: Nhava Sheva (GTI), Jebel Ali, Dammam, Singapore, Qingdao, Shanghai, Ningbo, Hong Kong, Yantian, Tanjung Pelepas, Singapore. According to the press release, Coscon currently also provides services to Europe, Mediterranean ports, Australia, South Africa and South American ports, the release emphasises.

# THE VALUE COLUMN

## EXPORT PROMOTION SCHEMES

Part 13

The EPCG scheme casts obligation to export the goods/services produced using the capital goods imported under concessional rate of customs duty, under this scheme. The export obligation is over and above the arithmetic mean of exports achieved in the preceding 3 licensing years. The exports made under the Advance Authorisation, Duty Free Import Authorisation, Duty Entitlement Pass Book schemes or drawback would be counted towards fulfillment of export obligation. For instance, goods manufactured using the capital goods imported under the EPCG scheme, can be exported under claim for drawback. Such exports, apart from earning drawback, will also be taken for calculation of export obligation fixed under the Authorisation under the EPCG scheme. So also for the exports made against imports of goods under the above mentioned schemes. The exports shall be physical exports, that is, actual exports to a place outside India. As per the definition of 'exports' under the Customs Act, 1962, 'exports' means taking to a place outside India. At the same time, certain categories of 'deemed exports' are also eligible for computing the exports made. By 'deemed exports' it is meant that the goods do not leave the Indian shores, but still are considered as exports. Supply of goods to the following categories is treated as 'deemed exports' and qualify for calculation of the quantum of exports: Supplies (i) to holders of authorizations under Advance Authorisation/Advance Authorisation for annual requirement/DFIA; (ii) to EOUs or STPs or EHTPs or BTPs; (iii) to projects financed by multilateral or bilateral agencies/funds as notified by Department of Economic Affairs, under International Competitive Bidding/ supply and installation of goods and equipment to projects financed by the above agencies for which bids may

have been invited and evaluated on the basis of Delivered Duty Paid prices for goods manufactured abroad; (iv) to any project or purpose in respect of which the Ministry of Finance permits imports of such goods at zero customs duty by issuing notification to this effect; (v) to power projects and refineries not covered under (iv) above; and (vi) to nuclear power projects through competitive bidding, as opposed to International Competitive Bidding. The capital goods can be procured from manufacturers in India, including EOUs; it is not necessary that the capital goods allowed under the EPCG Authorisation should only be imported. The domestic manufacturer from whom the capital goods are procured will also be benefited, since such supply is eligible for deriving the deemed export benefits. In case the supplier is an EOU, he can take such supply towards fulfillment of positive net foreign exchange. When the supply is made by EOU, the export obligation is fixed with reference to notional customs duty saved on FOR basis. If it is decided to procure the goods from indigenous sources, then, the authorization holder will have to request the Regional Authority for invalidation of the EPCG for direct import, and instead issue Advance Release Order. The ARO will contain the name of and address of the supplier of the capital goods. Such supplier can seek Advance Authorisation from Regional Authority for import of inputs, including components required for manufacture of the capital goods and supply to the authorization holder. In other words, the indigenous manufacturer can also import the inputs and components required for the manufacture of the capital goods under Advance Authorisation scheme; meaning that the inputs and components can be imported without payment of customs duty, and the capital goods manufactured and supplied against the authorization.

The capital goods can be procured from a domestic leasing company on lease. The scheme allows the holder of the authorization to undertake technological upgradation of the existing capital goods, subject to the satisfaction of the following conditions. It may be noted that this facility is available only for technological upgradation of the machinery already imported under this scheme. (1) The minimum time period for applying for the technological upgradation is 5 years from the authorization issue date; hence, the persons intending to upgrade the machinery must make the application within this period; (2) Using the capital goods which are sought to be upgraded, minimum 40% of the total obligation cast as per the first authorization must have been completed; (3) Export obligation would be re-fixed such that total export obligation for both capital goods would be sum total of 6 times the duty saved on both, which is to be achieved in 8 years from the date of issue of the new authorization; (4) Facility for technological upgradation will be given only once and the minimum import to be made shall be at least 10% of the existing investment in plant and machinery; and (5) Capital goods to be imported must be new and technologically superior to the capital goods already imported. In other words, old and used capital goods cannot be imported for the purpose of technological upgradation. If the capital goods imported under this scheme are found defective or unfit for use, they may be re-exported back to the foreign supplier within 3 years from the date of payment of duty on importation. Before effecting the re-export, necessary permission from the Customs and Regional Authority of the DGFT must be obtained. Replacement of such re-exported defective machinery is also permitted.
